
How to configure an iPhone using POP3 Mail01

This article explain show to configure an iPhone with a POP3 e-mail account. This process is simple and should only take a few minutes.


- 1. From the home screen, go to the **''Settings''** application.


3. Tap Add Account.

8. Tap **POP** and fill out the settings completely as follows:

Incoming Mail Server:

- Host Name: pop3.NaturalNetworks.com
- User name: Your complete e-mail address.
- **Password**: Your password for the corresponding e-mail address.

Outgoing Mail Server

- Host Name: smtp.NaturalNetworks.com
- User name: Your complete e-mail address.
- **Password**: Your password for the corresponding e-mail address.
